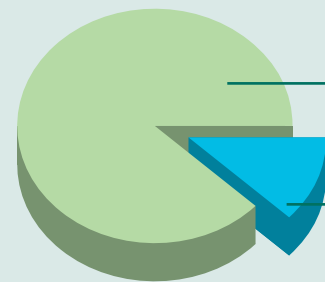
- **Stronger Communities**

TOTAL INVESTMENT IN INVERCLYDE'S GREEN NETWORK



Our Partnership generates value for money. In Inverclyde 4 Green Network projects have been developed. The projects are the first stage in guiding delivery of the Green Network.

Total investment in Inverclyde Green Network projects:	£99,811*
Contribution from Inverclyde Council:	£12,386

In 2009/2010 Inverclyde Council also contributed £4,850.69 to the Partnership's core funding of £300,000.

- Developing a demonstration site in Inverclyde (by 2011)

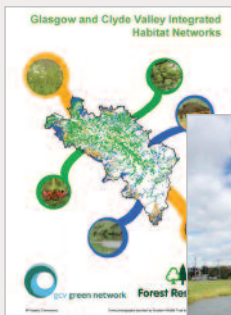

PROVIDING & SHARING EXPERTISE

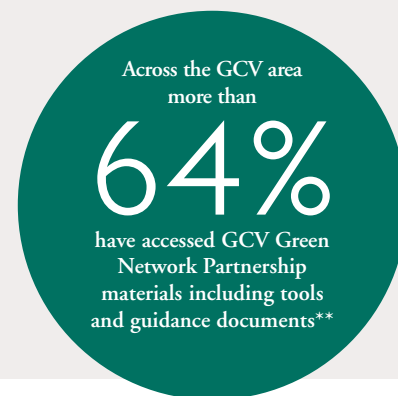


The Partnership is developing a suite of nationally recognised strategic tools & guidance materials. The effectiveness and efficiency of partner activity can only be enhanced through the development of such robust procedures and best practice.

Examples of such activity includes:

- Integrated Habitat Networks Model
- Planning Guidance
- Quality Guidance
- Funding & Management Guidance
- Vacant and Derelict Land Survey

Total investment in the development of these tools and guidance to date has been £624,388 with funding provided by 10 agency partners.
